

#### A devotion by Erika Bentsen

My horse hates his blanket. Pinned ears, stomping feet, a pop at me with his nose, Jack makes it clear that, although he is in his upper twenties, he is not cowardly. Normally an easygoing horse, blanketing him is one of the few activities in which I have to halter him. "Can't you see I'm trying to help you?" I tell him. Fortunately, there are usually only a few days a year in which I need to give him extra protection from the weather.

Jack had already shed out his winter coat when a late-season storm hit. Temperatures dropped into the teens with high winds and relentless snow that hurt when it skin. I brought grain out to give Jack a boost of warmth. Snow was caked over his back and left side. He was shivering. This time, he didn't stomp when I hauled out his blanket. I rubbed the snow off his back and draped the blanket over him. I could almost hear him sigh, "Aaaah!"

I admonish him, but Jack is exactly like me. I tell myself I'm tough. I don't need help. I can handle anything. I can, that is, until the storm comes. Then I want God's protection. #### **BUILDING USE GUIDELINES**

The Official Board of the First Christian Church has been designated as the officials responsible for the use of the church facilities. The church has adopted the following GUIDELINES to assure the best possible use of the building & facilities.

ALL FEES ARE PAYABLE IN ADVANCE. Make payment to the First Christian Church.

Applications for use approval shall be in writing and given to the church secretary. Applications are not a guarantee of use until approved by the Official Board and/or Trustees.

- 1. No smoking permitted on church property, No alcoholic beverages on church premises.
- 2. No games of chance (gambling) shall be permitted on church property.
- 3. Do not paint or attach any signs, displays, or materials to the building or grounds unless on a bulletin board.
- 4. Do Not use tape on walls, floors, doors or cabinetry.
- 5. Groups using the church must meet all local and state fire regulations.
- 6. Groups using the church shall confine their activities to the area designated on use agreement.
- 7. Groups using the church shall NOT use tacks, nails, staples, scotch tape, past, glue, paint or other materials which might damage or deface property of equipment, including pews.
- 8. The custodian fee will be applied for all weddings.
- 9. The sponsoring groups using the building assumes full responsibility for all who enter the premises attracted by the activity.
- 10. Any loss, damage or theft of supplies or equipment will be charged to the applicant.
- 11. All activities involving the use of the church shall be placed on the official church calendar in the office with the secretary.
- 12. The sanctuary is a place of worship and no program shall occur which is not consistent with this purpose.
- 13. All youth groups, high school age or younger, must have at least one responsible adult supervisor present at all times.
- 14. Chairs, tables, or other church property available for use off church premises only for church events.
- 15. Intended use of BURNING CANDLES must be approved prior to event.
- 16. A member of the church familiar with the kitchen equipment must be present to use kitchen equipment.
- 17. Sound techs must be present for use of the Sound System.
- 18. Thermostats are not to be adjusted.
- 19. Organ not to be used by other than church organist unless otherwise approved.
- 20. Permission to change any of these rules must be approved by the Board in writing.

The applicant agrees to be responsible for observing the above rules and regulations and to assume full responsibility and liability for personal injury, death in case of accident, loss or damage to personal property that my occur when these facilities are being used.

Groups, committees, etc. within the church will designate a person to be responsible for a door key and such person shall be familiar with special lock & lighting systems.

#### KITCHEN GUIDELINES

A church member must be present for use of kitchen equipment. Pick up an Activity Request Form from the church office. Applications for approval shall be in writing and given to the church secretary along with the deposit and the building use fee set by the trustees. Applications are not a guarantee of use until approved by the Official Board.

- 1. NO KITCHEN ITEMS LEAVE THE CHURCH WITHOUT PERMISSION FROM THE Disciples Women's Ministry.
- 2. All laundry, used from any events, will be put in a designated basket in the kitchen.
- 3. No food can be left in the refrigerator after a function.
- 4. No dirty dishes should be left in the sink or dishwasher.
- 5. All items must be put away in proper places.
- 6. Counters and appliances must be left clean.
- 7. Floor is to be swept and mopped if necessary.
- 8. All trash generated from your event must be taken to the trash bin in the parking lot. New trash liners must be put in trash containers. They are kept under the sink.
- 9. You must have permission from the DWM to use the dishes, glasses and tablecloths
- 10. Coffee makers must be cleaned and unplugged after use.
- 11. Anything broken or stained must be replaced by the group that sponsored the event.
- 12. Your deposit will be returned following your event if the kitchen and or fellowship hall is left in satisfactory condition.


## Caring & Sharing

The mission of the Caring & Sharing Food Pantry is to engage the local giving community and volunteers to help us serve our neighbors and work against food insecurity in Paulding County.

The Caring & Sharing Food Pantry operates a choice pantry, which allows each client to choose from the food we have available. They can visit two times per month, and we provide three days of food for the members of their household each visit.

### 2024 HIGHLIGHTS

- The pantry moved into a new, 3,800 square foot building at 318 N.
  Walnut Street in Paulding.
- We purchased and installed a walk-in freezer.
- ➤ The number of clients who visited the pantry grew 300% since 2021.
- ➤ We served 7,957 people, or 2,919 households.
  - 83% of the households came once a month or less, although they can visit twice per month.
  - We welcomed 167 new households and did not receive visits from 33 households we served in 2023.



- ➤ The pantry received 152,000 pounds of food and personal hygiene items in 2024.
  - 30% of food we provide is donated, 30% is from other food programs and 40% is purchased.
- ➤ Caring & Sharing is run by 2 part-time staff members and 100 volunteers.

## Did You Know?

- According to Feeding American, 13.6% of Paulding County neighbors struggle with food insecurity.
- 2. 47% of the students in our county qualify for free or reduced lunches, based on school data.

Over the last two years, we have received more than \$18,000 through the program. The most recent campaign ended March 29, and the results aren't known yet. The pantry uses all SimplyGive proceeds to buy food from Meijer at wholesale prices.
