Joshua 1:9

Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be frightened, and do not be dismayed, for the LORD your God is with you wherever you go.

Moses risked his life by confronting Pharaoh and leading the Israelites out of slavery, demonstrating faith and obedience to God's call. Esther risked her life by approaching the king to plead for her people, showcasing courage and compassion. Jesus, through his willingness to suffer and die for the sake of humanity, exemplified the ultimate risk taken for love and redemption. It's easy for us to stay in our comfort zone. We have an established home, an established job, an established family, and an established daily routine. That's comfortable, and that's easy to negotiate. The truth is---God wants more from us. God wants us to risk our comfortable existence like Moses, Esther, and Jesus. I believe we stay in our comfort lane, because we are afraid to leave it. If we risk getting into a new relationship, a new commitment, or a new way of life---we could mess up what we've established, and that makes us uncomfortable. That is exactly what God wants from us---to be uncomfortable sometimes. If we are willing to risk ourselves, we may find a better life, we may find a new way to serve, and we may find a new way to live for the glory of God. Do not be frightened to step out of your comfort zone!

From the Elders A devotion by Leslie Koh entitled Clinging To God's Promises

Wendy was feeling a little left out. During lunch break, her boss had left chocolates on everyone's desk-except hers. Puzzled, she lamented to a friend, "Why did he leave me out?" When asked, their boss explained: "Those chocolates are still good,, but they've been around for some time. Wendy's pregnant, so I just wanted to play it extra safe." Then he laughed. "As for the rest of you..."

The little incident became a running joke in the office, but it got me thing about how we sometimes misread God's intentions because of our limited understanding and perception. We may even believe ourselves to be victims of unfair treatment, forgetting that God always has our best interest at heart. Always.

Isaiah 55: 8-9 reminds us that while we may not fully understand God's thoughts and ways, we can be sure that they're "higher than (our) ways" (v.9) Ours are often influenced by selfish desires; His perfect, compassionate, and righteous. So even when things don't look good for now, trust that God will provide what we truly need (vv. 1-2), for He's loving and faithful to His ow everlasting promise (v. 3). Let's "call on him while he is near" (v.6), knowing that He'll never leave us.

Which promises of God can you hold on to when life seems unfair? Which aspects of His character give you comfort and assurance?

Faithful God, You know I sometimes feel left out of Your blessings and doubt Your love for me. Please help me to trust in You and to hold on tightly to Your everlasting promises.

The Best Gift for Your Pastor

October is Pastor Appreciation Month—a time to recognize and encourage those who faithfully shepherd our churches. But if you've ever asked a pastor how to show your gratitude, the answer probably isn't a plaque or applause. More often than not, it's simple: "Pray for me."

Even the Apostle Paul didn't ask for much personally, except for the prayers of fellow believers. In his letter to the Romans, he wrote: "Now I urge you, brothers and sisters, by our Lord Jesus Christ and by the love of the Spirit, to strive together with me in your prayers to God for me, that I may be rescued from those who are disobedient in Judea, and that my service for Jerusalem may prove acceptable to the saints; so that I may come to you in joy by the will of God and relax in your company" (Romans 15:30–32, NASB).

This October—and every month—encourage your pastor by offering your prayers, support, and kind words. Ministry can be demanding, but knowing the church is lifting them up makes all the difference.

In A Million Little Ways (Revell), Emily Freeman says in order for Christians to "show up as you are with what you've been given," we must confront these statements:

- I'm not cut out for this.
- Someone else can do it better.
- People might not like it.
- I have nothing to offer.
- I hate my calling.
- It's a waste of time.
- It's too much work.
- Who do you think you are?
- "A million loud voices ... keep us from the million little ways [Jesus] wants to show up through us to the world," Freeman writes.






Create a simple and meaningful prayer box your family can use to share requests and pray together all week long.

- 1. Wrap the shoebox like a gift, wrapping the lid separately so it can be opened.

- 3. Place the box somewhere central, like the kitchen or living room.
- 4. Keep index cards and pens nearby. When someone has a prayer request, they can write or draw it and drop it in.

2 Corinthians 5:17-21

Paul's words in 2 Corinthians 5 are nothing short of revolutionary. He invites us to see the world no longer "from a human point of view," but through the lens of God's new creation. In Christ, the old order—built on rivalry, suspicion, and estrangement—has been decisively overturned. This is not a private, inward experience alone; it is the launching of a new social reality in which divisions are healed and relationships restored. God's reconciling work is about transforming the way we live together here and now. To belong to Christ is to belong to this ministry—a vocation in which our every word, every action, is shaped by the message that God has already made peace with the world through Jesus.

And because God has entrusted to us this ministry of reconciliation, the Church becomes the main organization of God's new creation in a fragmented world. We are living signs that a different way is possible, and indeed, is already underway. In a culture built on lines and labels, we step beyond boundaries to form alliances built on the teachings of Jesus Christ. Our special offering today is not just a donation—it is a declaration that we stand with God's reconciling mission, confident that the same love that raised Jesus from the dead can raise up a new creation among us.

The Reconciliation Ministry Special Offering is received each year in congregations on the last Sunday in September and the first Sunday in October (in solidarity with World Communion Sunday). Half of each gift remains in the region from which it is sent.

Funds generated by this special emphasis are used throughout the year to provide education, programming, and service through grants to:
